

SYRIAN REFUGEES ARRIVING IN CANADA

Government-Organized flights from December 10th to January 31st, 2016.

Purpose of Report:

This report provides basic statistical information on Syrian Refugees destined for Canada and Ontario including destination communities in Ontario, refugee category, breakdown by age, family size, and sex.

The format of this report will evolve based on the availability and quality of data and feedback from recipients.

Reporting Period:

This report covers the period of **December 10th, 2015 through January 31st, 2016** (Dec 10th was the arrival date of the first government-organized flight to Canada). A total of **57 flights** have arrived in Toronto (35) and Montreal (22) as the two points of entry for all Syrian refugees in the above mentioned time period.

A total of 14,269 refugees have arrived in Canada, of which 6,114 are estimated to be in Ontario, representing 43% of arrivals to date.

Data Sources and Limitations:

Information in this report comes from Immigration Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and uses 1) the list of government-organized flights posted on the IRCC website identifying destination communities and 2) detailed reports sent to the provinces by IRCC confirming basic information such as refugee category, ages, family size and sex.

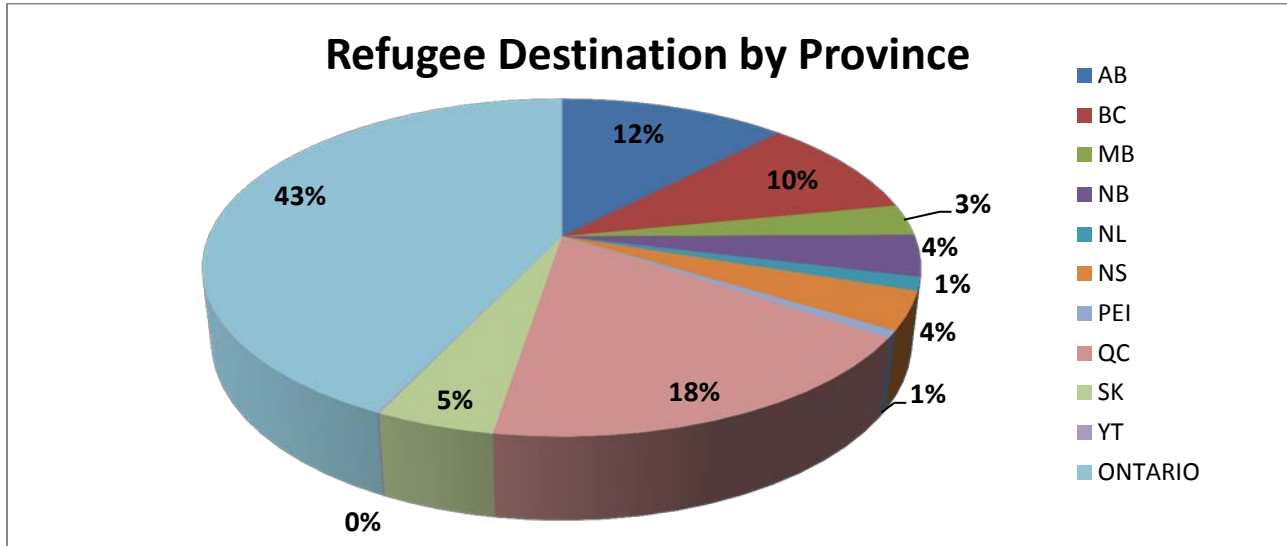
Detailed data on the first two flight arrivals (Dec. 10 and Dec 15) is not available from IRCC. There were 298 refugees destined for Ontario on two flights and information is not included in the charts and tables (#3 to #6) at this point.

Given the rapid implementation of the Syrian Refugee initiative, there are some data quality issues resulting in some variation in counts in certain charts and tables. There are also issues identified in the incorrect identification of refugee categories and efforts are underway to correct the data where applicable. It is expected that this will normalize over time.

Acronyms and Age:

There are three refugee categories identified as: GARs – Government Assisted Refugees; PSRs – Privately Sponsored Refugees; BVORs – Blended Visa Office Referrals. Adults and Children have been identified as between the ages of 0 to 17 as children and adults from the ages of 18 to 60+.

Chart 1 – Refugee Destination by Province

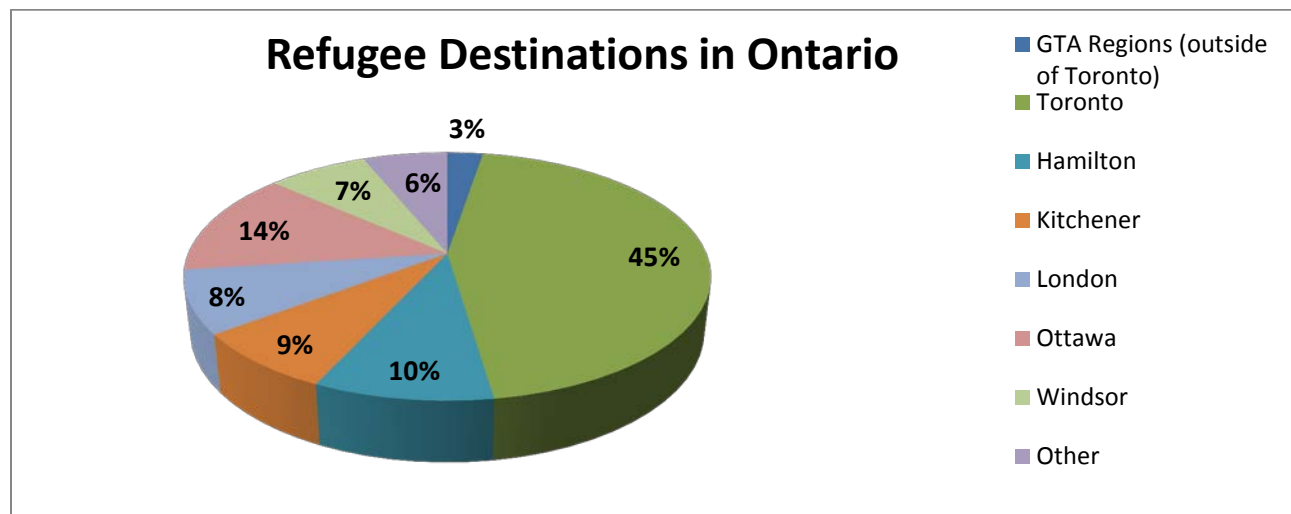

Chart 2 – Refugee Destinations within Ontario

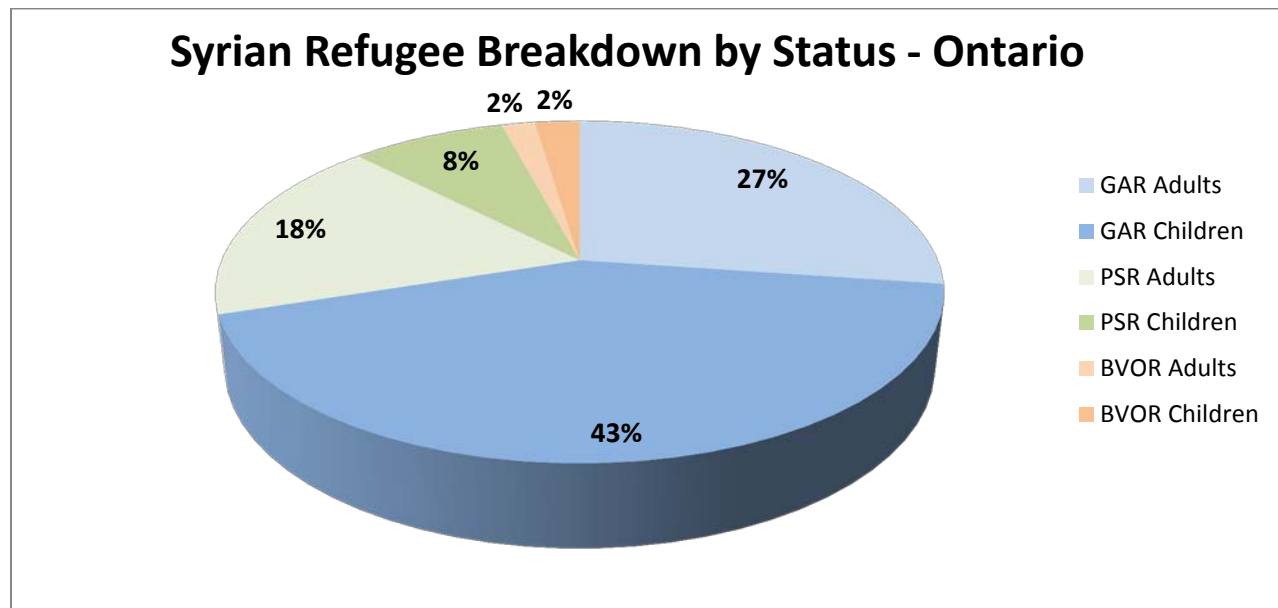

Chart 4 – Breakdown by Age and Refugee Category – Ontario

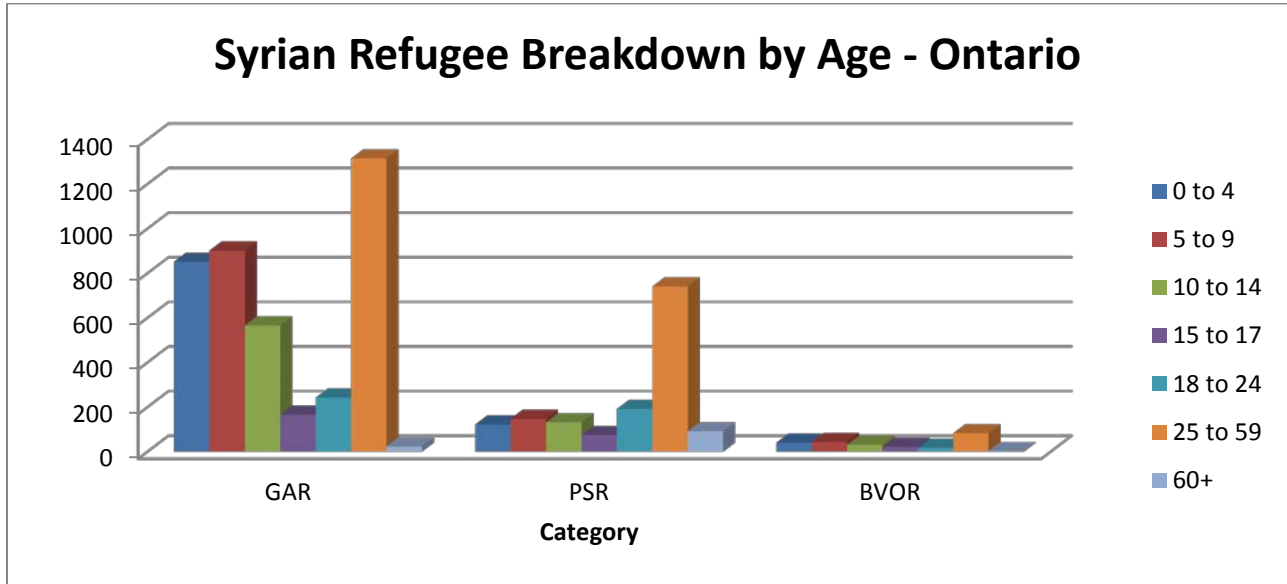

Chart 5 – Breakdown by Family Size and Refugee Category – Ontario

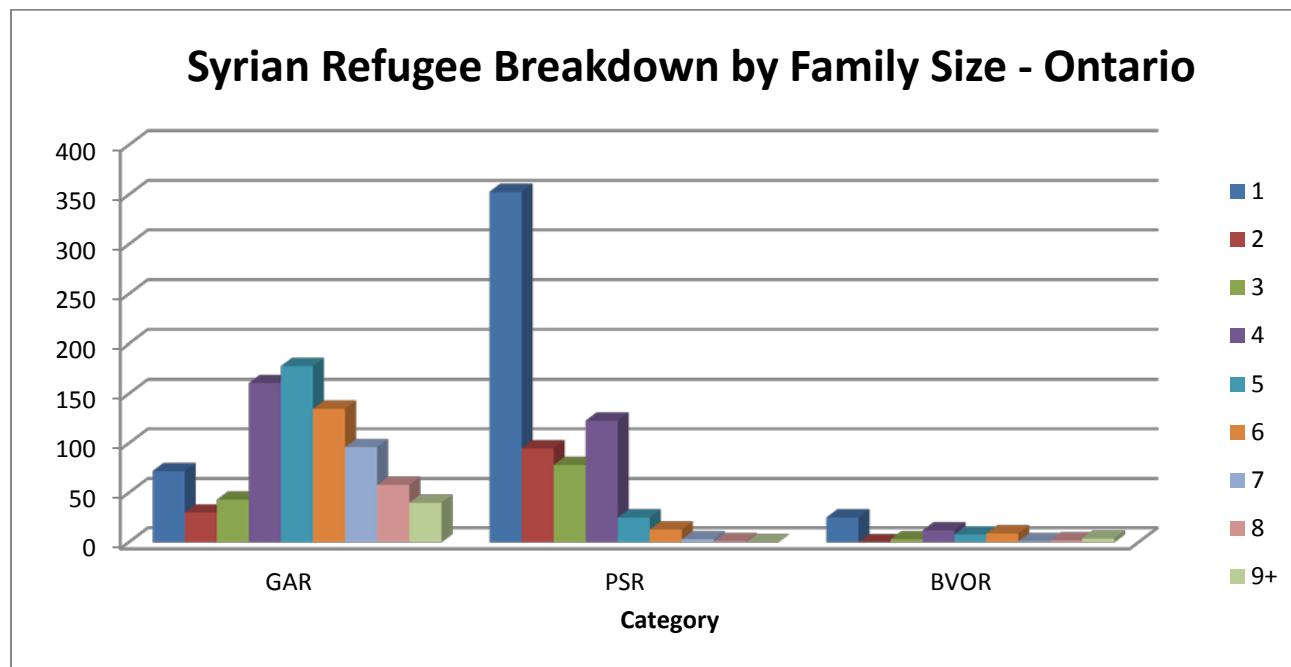

Chart 6 – Breakdown by Sex and Refugee Category - Ontario

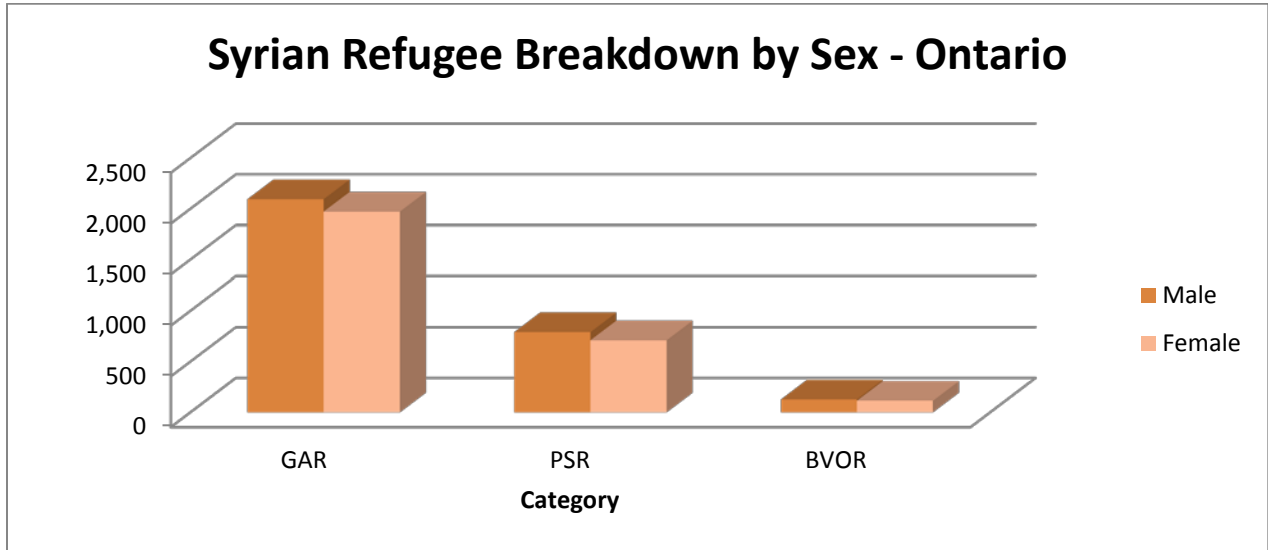
